

ACADEMICS

- KIIS regards international education as a meaningful, intellectual and pedagogical exercise aimed at taking full advantage of the host country environment.
- Faculty may apply to teach on multiple summer programs but must submit a separate application for each program.
- Language professors may apply to teach on any KIIS summer program.
- Non-language professors may apply to teach on any KIIS program except Munich, Paris II, Spain I, and Spain II.
- Programs are open to all undergraduate, graduate and honors students as well as those not currently enrolled in a college or university.
- Students must register for at least one 3-credit course for academic credit but most choose two 3-credit hour courses in the summer.
- Students need a minimum 2.0 GPA (2.75 GPA for semester programs) at the time of application.
- Credit is awarded by Western Kentucky University and is automatically transferred to student's home institution.
