ENG 349 Topic: Travel Writing: Spain

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Syllabus subject to change

This course explores travel writing about Spain. How did the experience of traveling in Spain inspire writers? Why were poets, novelists, and essayists drawn to Spain over other countries? How did their immersion in Spanish culture, politics, and history transform their art and challenge their assumptions and beliefs? Some of the authors and texts that we will read include Ernest Hemingway, George Orwell, Colm Tóibín, Langston Hughes, and Martha Gellhorn, among others. We will consider specifically how the experiences of travel in Spain provided writers with many possibilities to remake their identities, to learn from new cultural encounters, and to engage in literary experimentation. Students will also learn how to write about their travel experiences in Spain. Students may choose from several narrative forms, including the essay, photo-journalism, video documentary, poetry, the short story, and the blog.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Students are expected to read a selection of travel writing about Spain; to visit historical and cultural sites in Barcelona and write about their experiences and observations; to become acquainted with the genre of travel writing; and to synthesize the course material through the excursions, quizzes, and creative project.

Students will keep a reflective journal, which will be periodically collected and graded. This journal will count for 40% of the final course grade. Students will also create a 10-15 page travel narrative, which will count for 30%. Quizzes will contribute the remaining 30% of the final course grade.
