MUS 338 Directed Study: Instrumental & Choral Conducting

# **Course Description:**

This course serves as an introduction to the fundamental techniques and methods of instrumental and choral conducting.

# **Course Objectives and Outcomes**

In this course we will learn the fundamental conducting techniques required of an effective conductor. Students will gain their confidence in directing choral and instrumental ensembles through increased knowledge of posture, breath, gesture, time patterns (1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and subdivisions thereof), onset and offset gestures, fermatas, cues, dynamics, articulation, tempo changes, irregular meter, independence of hands, baton technique and expressive considerations. These skills will be supplemented by an analysis of related fields and their influence on expressive conducting gesture, including chironomy, the Saito method and Laban movement science. Furthermore attention will be paid to score study, conductor preparation skills, ear training, self-evaluation and critique and other pedagogical considerations.

#### **Assessment**

Short written quizzes on basic terminology in conducting and score reading. Conducting exams.

Group work.

Reflection on recorded footage.

Analysis and reflection of other conductors at concerts or other events in Salzburg.
