CD 472 Topics: Assessment and Intervention in the Czech Republic

Course Description: Students will learn and experience speech pathology services that are provided in the Czech Republic. Identification of different methodologies employed by clinicians in the Czech Republic for treating communication disorders will be emphasized. Students will study first-hand examples of diagnostic and treatment approaches. The experience will give students a foundation for further studies in speech-language pathology and a means to contrast U.S. based practices with other countries.
