1. Course Description: FREN 201 and FREN 202 is an intensive intermediate language sequence taken consecutively during the KIIS Paris 2 program in July. The courses work to achieve intermediate French through reading, writing, listening, speaking, and cultural competence intensively while in Paris. The courses will work to expand grammatical understanding through practice in an immersive setting. The courses will focus on oral and written practice, vocabulary building, study of grammar, and introduce the reading of literary or cultural texts. Students will be required to enroll in both courses. FREN 201 and FREN 202 meet 5 hours a day for 4 days a week (see schedule below). Students will work on developing their grammatical and pronunciation accuracy through writing and speaking activities.

2. Overall KIIS Program Student Learning Outcomes:

Prior to your KIIS study abroad program, and again at the conclusion of your program, KIIS will ask each student to a) answer a few multiple-choice questions, and b) write a short reflective essay (two paragraphs in length) related to the elements detailed above. There is no right or wrong answer, and your responses will not affect your grade in any way. The purpose of the exercise is to help KIIS measure the effectiveness of its study abroad programs.

5. Fulfillment of General Education Requirement: This course will satisfy a 3hr third semester Intermediate French course and a 3hr fourth semester French course.

6. Required Readings and Materials: Students will buy a copy of the textbook Édito and accompanying workbook in Paris. Both textbook and workbook together should cost around \$30. There is a free app for smartdevices to accompany the book with videos, practice dialogues, and pronunciation activities.

7. Graded Assignments:

Assessment	Percentage
 Participation This is an assessment of a student's daily engagement. Students must actively, verbally participate in the course and complete textbook activities. 	20%
 Homework Students will be assigned various workbook activities to complete each unit. The grade will be based on completion. 	20%
 Weekly Journal Students will keep a journal of their experiences abroad which will be collected at regular intervals. They will then be given feedback on their entries based on a provided rubric. The grade will be determined on writing proficiency at the end of the program. 	30%
 Oral Exams Students will have a weekly oral exam discussing each week's contents and activities. They will then be given feedback on their performance based on a provided rubric. The grade will be determined on oral proficiency at the end of the program. 	30%

8. Attendance Policy:

KIIS program participants are expected to be punctual to and in attendance at all classes, presentations, meetings and required excursions, and to remain with the program for the full academic period. Unexcused absences from classes and/or mandatory meetings will result in a lowering of the student's final grade, as will excessive tardiness. Multiple unexcused absences could result in expulsion from the program. Any absence from an academic class session must be excused for medical reasons.

9. Disability Accommodation:
