- All classes will participate together in planned excursions to museums, cathedrals, city tours, ancient ruins, etc.
- Class sessions will be divided into A and B blocks, typically with A in the morning and B in the afternoon.
- Some excursions are optional (as noted).
- For each date, the city name is provided (where we will be staying that evening)
- Florence Hotel <u>Foresteria Valdese</u> (in the Oltrarno district, "Florence's coolest/hippest neighborhood," near Piazza Santo Spirito, just across the river from downtown, very walkable)
- Siena Hotel Hotel Alma Domus (great location in the noble 'Oca' contrada, near the home of St. Catherine, across the 'Silva' valley from the cathedral)
- Rome Hotel Hotel Trastevere (in the heart of Trastevere, right next to Piazza San Cosimato)

The KIIS summer program in Italy begins in the Oltrarno quarter of Florence with an exploration of the Renaissance city's world-class art and architecture and surroundings. It then moves to the Trastevere district of the ancient and modern capital of Rome, visiting museums, classical ruins, historic churches, palaces and other destinations. By investigating Italian art and history and taking part in the local culture, students become acquainted with the Italian people, their culture and their way of life.
